Good for your soul kaitiaki enables businesses, visitors, and locals to support biodiversity in Hauraki Coromandel by donating native trees for local planting projects. Each tree is locally/eco-sourced, and \$1 of each tree donation goes towards the vision of a predator-free Hauraki Coromandel.

By becoming a planting site, your location will be featured on the Hauraki Coromandel Travel App and www.thecoromandel.com. People and businesses can select your site and contribute to your protect.

Requirements

- Your site must be able to plant at least 100 trees.
- Provide an outline of the site. e.g google maps.
- Provide photos for promotion on the website and app.
- Your site must help enrich the visitor experience.



Site Preparation + Planting

- The landowner is expected to prepare the site and plant the trees, but you could, for example, organise events for planting days with schools, volunteers or community groups to lend a hand.
- Trees will be available to plant during the 2025 planting season (March-October), depending on weather and site readiness.



Ongoing Maintenance & Long-Term Involvement

- Once the trees are planted, you're responsible for their maintenance.
- Your site can continue receiving trees each planting season, making it an ongoing, long-term project.
- Access to information of the site for ongoing marketing and promotion.
